Dr. Eourn Um Sam (Cambodia, Ph.D. in NT) is pastoring his home church while also overseeing three provincial churches. His studies were guided by Prof. Kim, Kyu Seop, whose expertise and encouragement played a significant role in shaping Sam's academic and ministry journey. Sam's story of faith and ministry reflects God's transformative work in his life and calling.

As we celebrate these graduates, we are particularly blessed to hear from Dr. Sam, whose academic journey and research have profound implications for understanding Paul's teachings in the letter to the Colossians. Dr. Sam's doctoral thesis, titled "In Search of God's Knowledge: Moral Progress in Paul and the Colossians," explores the transformative concept of ἐπίγνωσις (true knowledge) in the life of believers.

Dr. Sam's Academic and Ministry Reflections

In his thesis, Dr. Sam highlights how Paul emphasizes union with Christ as the foundation of moral transformation. Rejecting Jewish mystical asceticism and strict legal observance, Paul teaches that true moral progress is rooted in Christ, who embodies the fullness of God's presence (Col. 2:9, 19). For Paul, ἐπίγνωσις is more than intellectual understanding; it is a knowledge that renews believers in Christ's image, leading to sanctification, unity, and love within the community of faith (Col. 3:10). Dr. Sam situates Paul's teachings within the broader religio-social context, contrasting them with prevailing Jewish and Greco-Roman philosophies. His research explores how living out Christ's story results in epistemological sanctification—a transformation that reflects God's revealed knowledge in Christ and fosters moral progress.

Reflecting on this journey, Dr. Sam shares how his studies have shaped both his personal faith and his ministry: "Firstly, I want to give all glory and honor to God and express my deep gratitude to ACTS for providing me the opportunity to pursue my studies, culminating in the completion of my doctorate. This significant achievement has strengthened my ability to serve the churches with even greater responsibility. In particular, I have been able to focus on teaching, training Christian leaders, and faithfully preaching the word of truth. The knowledge and insights I gained during my studies have equipped me to contribute meaningfully to the spiritual growth of our congregation and the broader Christian community. With this academic foundation, I now feel more confident in my ability to write books that are both scholarly and spiritually enriching. My hope is that these works will inspire readers and provide guidance for their faith journeys."

A Momentous Event: Fourth Lausanne Congress

The Korean Church had the distinct honor of hosting the fourth Lausanne Congress in Incheon from September 22-28, 2024. This year's congress marked the 50th anniversary of the Lausanne Movement, held under the theme "Let the Church Declare and Display Christ Together." It was an extraordinary event that brought together 5,000 Christian leaders from around the world. It was a transformative moment where the global Church united in worship, fostering collaboration, and renewing a shared vision to advance Christ's mission across the world.

After graduating from AIGS, Dr. Katoshe was appointed as a full-time pastor for the church's growing English ministry, where he and his wife faithfully serve both international students and Korean congregants.

Honoring the Life of Rev. Dr. Lal Thlan Hlua

It is with great sadness but also hope in Christ that we share the news of the passing of **Rev. Dr. Lalthlanhlua** (Myanmar, Th.M. in MI, 2013), who was called into the glory of the Lord on December 13, 2024, at his home in Tahan-Kalaymyo, Myanmar, at the age of 55. His life was a testimony of faithful service, impactful leadership, and unwavering devotion to God.

Family Background

Rev. Dr. Lalthlanhlua came from a spiritual heritage deeply rooted in the Church of Jesus Christ. His father, Lal Chung Nunga, was one of the founding leaders of the Church of Jesus Christ in Tahan-Kalaymyo, Myanmar, and was known for his deep spirituality and devotion to the Lord. Rev. Dr. Lalthlanhlua married Miss Zonunhlimi, a Christian musical band leader whose ministry in music complemented his pastoral calling. Together, they were blessed with three children, two born early in their marriage and a son born after completing his theological studies in Korea.

Rev. Dr. Lalthlanhlua's theological journey began in Bangalore, India, where he earned his B.Th. and B.Div. degrees during the 1990s. He was a gifted preacher whose leadership saw the multiplication of the congregation at the Church of Jesus Christ. His dedication to the ministry was evident as he consistently led his congregation with vision and passion.

In 2011, he pursued a Th.M. program at AIGS (ACTS) in Korea, which he completed in 2013. His time at AIGS not only enriched his theological understanding but also deepened his commitment to God's work. After returning from Korea, he and his wife were blessed with their third child, a sign of God's continued faithfulness in their lives.
